

David Price is Emeritus Professor, Public International Law and Intellectual Property Law in the School of Law, Charles Darwin University, Australia. He holds degrees in law as well as international relations, industrial history, and Chinese. His doctoral research entitled "Intellectual Property Legal Regimes in the Arabian Gulf States: Infidels at the Gates", was published by Routledge-Cavendish, UK in 2009, with an updated edition in conjunction with Dr Alhanoof AlDebasi published in 2019.

His primary research work is upon the interrelationship between, and strategic dynamics of, the of public international law, international trade agreements and intellectual property

law. This research work has extended to the settlement of disputes encompassing these areas, particularly in respect of the application of Investor-State Dispute Settlement (ISDS) procedures. He has published extensively in these areas, focussing upon the GCC, Indonesia and ASEAN, and Australia as exemplars. David has worked, consulted, and researched in institutions in Indonesia, Australia, UK, Europe, and

the Middle East. He has held Visiting Professorships in Indonesia and China. He was a member of the management team of Sohar College of Applied Sciences, now Sohar University, Sultanate of Oman 1999-2001. David retired in July 2022 but remains research active. He still publishes, and undertakes occasional research supervision and lecturing at CDU. He is a member of editorial boards in the UK, Indonesia and Oman, and academic organisations in Australia and overseas.
